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# **BAK POYA**

The month of Bak is of special significance to Sri Lankans as the Blessed One is said to have visited Nagadipa in Northern Sri Lanka to settle a dispute between Kings Chulodara and Mahodara. The

Mahawamsa chronicles the story of how in the fifth year of Enlightenment, The Buddha perceived with His Divine Eye, that the uncle and nephew were about to declare war on each other over the ownership of a very valuable and magnificent gem studded throne.

The Mahavamsa relates how the Buddha used his psychic powers to tame the warring factions.

Hovering in the air above them, he first created complete darkness and then performed the twin miracle – the *yamaka maha prathiharya*. The astonished Naga tribes laid down their weapons and listened to the Buddha's teachings on peace and non-hatred.

The Naga kings paid homage to Buddha with overwhelming faith and they became pious devotees. Together, the uncle and nephew offered the throne to the Blessed One.

This is said to be the Buddha's second visit to Sri Lanka.
