The Atavisi Buddha Puja is a regular part of our Vesak celebrations. We remember the twenty eight Buddhas who preceded Gautama Buddha and recite stanzas recalling their virtues. As has been done previously, two offerings are made to each Buddha. One is a *pirikara* of a robe, and the other a tray of offerings consisting of flowers, a candle, *gilanpasa* and *chatumadura*. Much merit is gained when we make these offerings.

Dayakathwaya for each of the two offerings is for a donation of \$50.00 which will go to the building fund. This is also one of our regular fundraisers.
